Scrapbook compiled by Ralph Lloyd-Edgley primarily relating to athletes and athletics meetings during the 1920s. The volume also contains articles relating to other sporting events including horse racing, tennis, fencing and rugby football. Content includes articles, images, reports and cartoons. Most have been taken from unidentified, and undated, newspapers. Some pages in the volume have been partially cut out, obscuring some cuttings.

featuring Suzanne Lenglen; the boxer Jack Dempsey with his film star wife, Estelle Taylor; ballet; women playing a modified game of rugby football; women fencers and tennis players; contestants at beauty competition held in Yugoslavia; Rev Lionel Ford and his son, Neville Montague Ford, headmaster of Harrow School; various pictures of animals and children; and images of members of the royal family including Prince of Wales, Princess Mary, George V and the Hungarian royal family.
